Worship during Holy Week relives those moments that lead up to the terrible treatment and eventual death of our Lord. On Good Friday the events reach their climax when Jesus finally lays down his life for the world. We remember this moment in our worship, with, among other things, a reading of the Passion Narrative from St John's Gospel. The Jesus that we walk with in John's Passion Narrative is not like the Jesus that St Mark, St Matthew or St Luke portrays in their Passion accounts. In John's Gospel we see Jesus in full control of the events that are happening around him. He is no victim. The depth of his faith and the unity he has with God does not protect him from the events that strip him of his dignity, or the pain and suffering metered out to him. Throughout his ordeal, Jesus never loses sight that all things are in the Father's hands and therefore hope cannot be extinguished or diminished. Jesus does not lose sight of the eternal.

For a number of weeks now the world has been trying to control the spread of Coronavirus. It has caused a great deal of worry and stress. Many have been frightened and in one way or another we have all had to adapt to rapidly changing conditions. Some have reacted in ways that can only be described as panic and have given little thought to their neighbour. The sight of an elderly lady in one of our superstores crying because she had no toilet rolls was heart breaking. Others on the other hand, have shown great generosity and a calm

resolve not to become victims, either to the virus or to the hysteria that results in stripping shelves bare.

We can learn a lot from the Jesus of St John's Gospel. We can learn to be calm in the face of difficult situations, we can learn to take control of our emotions but, most of all, we must not lose sight of the hope that is Jesus Christ. Of course, it is prudent to take suitable precautions, but it is during Holy Week and Easter we are reminded of Eternity. Never lose sight of hope and always remember our lives are but part of a bigger landscape, that of the Kingdom and of Eternity.

POSTSCRIPT. Events over the past few weeks have left us all re negotiating the way we live and conduct our lives. The cessation of public worship does not mean that the Parish of ABE has ceased its prayer life for all people within our care. Our churches are open for private prayer and contemplation, and the daily offices are being said. The Eucharist is still being offered although it is being done so with the Priest only but in some cases it will be streamed on social media. Keep checking the Parish website and notices at the Parish Office. However, I would like to reassure you that our regular worshippers, the people that we live with, our neighbours, our care homes, our businesses, shops and key workers and all in our community are all being held before God in our prayers. Above all watch out for one another, help when it is safe to be able to do so, and look forward with hope to more stable times, which will certainly happen.

THE BARNHAM CHURCHYARD PROJECT

Marshall Close was named after the Marshall brothers who were set up as nurserymen by their father in the 1880s. EJ Marshall, Headmaster of Brighton Grammar School, retired to The Cottage, Church Lane. A plaque inside the church was installed by the 'old boys'.

His sons, Henry and Sydney, went their own ways with Sydney the most enterprising founding Barnham Nurseries covering by 1940 over 300 acres and becoming the biggest employer in the area. Sydney was a church warden at St Mary's and a member of Westhampnett RDC.

Henry established his nursery at Sunnyside in Yapton Road. He served on Barnham

Parish Council and his wife Sophie was the first president of Barnham WI: she laid the foundation stone at the new village hall in 1927.

Barnham Nursery land behind the shops was sold for housing - hence Nursery Close and Appletree Drive. The garden centre opposite The Murrell Arms became Garden Crescent.

Henry and Sophie are buried at St Mary's (1924 and 1937) where 3 of their children and 4 of their grandchildren were baptised. Sunnyside was sold in 1950 to Thomas Beck who lived next door at Highview House - but that's another family story... (see the Memorial file at St Mary's Church).



NEWS FROM OUR SCHOOLS



ORMISTON SIX VILLAGES ACADEMY

WW1 Battlefields

The deadline for the April issue of the Parish News coincided with the announcement that the government were closing schools in light of the Coronavirus outbreak.

Despite the obvious uncertainty of how long our academy will be closed for, we are steadfast in our commitment to support the education of our pupils through online teaching and learning. We will be thinking of them, their families and the wider parish community during this unprecedented time.

For now though, we would love to share news of our recent trip to the WWI Battlefields which gave pupils a chance to explore the stories of our local soldiers:

On 9th February, Mr Rondel had the honour and privilege to take four pupils from the academy

around the battlefields of Belgium and France on a 4-day residential visit, arranged

by the Commonwealth War Graves Commission. Mr Rondel said, "Isobel, Millie, Lewis and Rhys have been a credit to the academy and have fully partaken in everything. I am so proud at the level of respect they showed throughout the week and hope they will have memories to last a lifetime."

The group arrived safely in Belgium despite the stormy weekend and visited the Memorial Museum Passchendaele 1917 and the trenches experience, and saw the life of everyday people during the war. At the Lijssenthoek Cemetery they got an understanding of the huge effort of the Commonwealth War Graves Commission as well as the chance to apply and see what they have done in GCSE History in person. Pupils here saw the number of unknown graves and got an understanding of the >>



<< scale of the loss. They also sought out the listing for Wilfred Dibley, who lived on the same road as our academy, and lost his life serving on the battlefield. In the evening everyone took part in the Menin Gate ceremony in Ypres, paying their respects whilst looking at the names of those without graves.

On the last day pupils saw how the final steps of the war led to victory for Britain and the Commonwealth and where the armistice was signed on 11th November 1918.

"I thoroughly enjoyed the Tyne Cot Cemetery because it was very thought-provoking. It was extremely important to honour our local soldier, Wilfred Dibley, by laying down a symbol of remembrance." Millie

NEWS FROM OUR COUNCILS



BARNHAM & EASTERGATE PARISH COUNCIL

The meeting of Barnham and Eastergate Parish Council took place on 3rd March, before the Covid-19 crisis began.

All councillors were present together with several members of the public and one member of the press.

County Councillor, Derek Whittington, had given his apologies and had no significant items to report.

Under finance the payments made since the last meeting were noted and the appointment of R S Hall and Co as the internal auditor for the 2019/20 accounts was approved. Other financial matters discussed and agreed during the meeting included approval of submission of a grant funding application for the replacement of the Eastergate Village Hall gas boiler and approval of funds of £6,500 to commission drawings for the potential extension of Eastergate Village Hall and a new Eastergate Pavilion.

Community facilities updates confirmed continued excellent usage and activities at both Eastergate Village Hall and Barnham Community Hall. It was also noted that the merger of the hall charities to form the new Barnham and Eastergate Community Trust was almost finalised.

Due to significant representation from local residents the Council (rather than the Planning Committee) considered the application BN/18/20 – Former Brooks Nursery (Variation of condition to change the foul drainage scheme from Sewage Treatment Plan to Pumping station). The application seeks approval to move to a mains sewer

system by laying a pipe from the Upton Brooks development into the sewer pipe in Elm Grove South, a solution that the local residents believe would be totally wrong and cause untold problems. The Council was supportive of their views and agreed to submit an objection that would make reference to the Neighbourhood Plan drainage policy and would suggest that the connection to the main sewer should be through the estate Barnham Road, unless a Southern Water technical report that is anticipated contains sufficient evidence to prove that the solution they are proposing is the right one. The final draft of a parish newsletter was circulated for final comment with the aim of getting it printed and distributed before the end of March.

The chair reported on ongoing email exchanges with the Library Service over the potential provision of a Tier 7 Library. I reported on a few issues including the A27 Arundel Bypass consultation corrections; a proposal to look at a traffic free route along the Ford to Hunston Canal (being promoted by a local group); and the need for a Death of a Royal Protocol to be agreed.

The Council also considered an email from ADC which listed suggestions for a name for the new BEW Strategic site. The Council rejected all suggestions and put forward their own which have been sent to ADC for consideration.



There was a reason why no-one wanted to be the least important - the roads were mud and everyone's feet got very dirty.


It was the job of the least important servant to wash everyone's feet...


